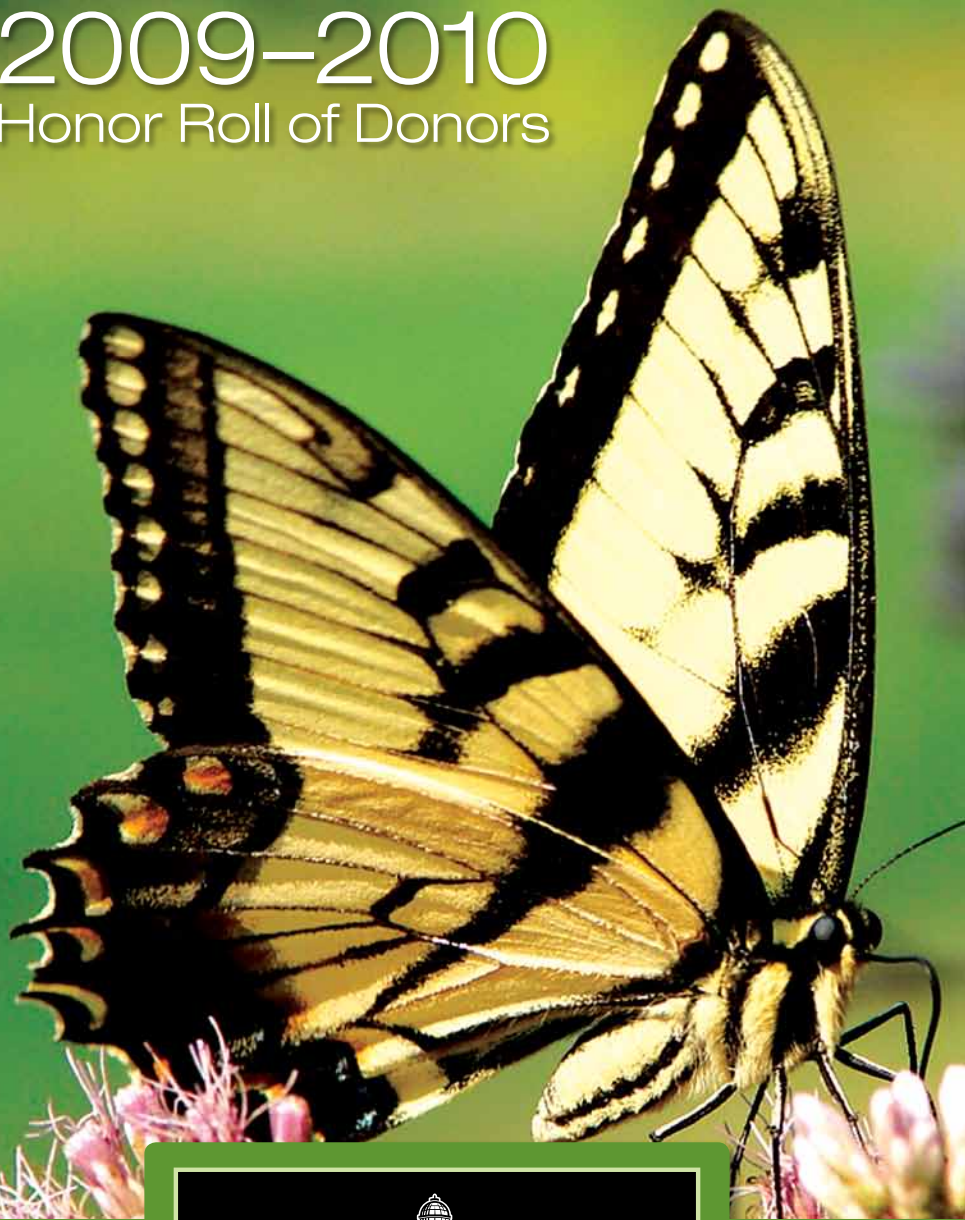


The Children's Garden Players, our young adult volunteers, learn side-by-side with adults through our service-learning program, where they develop life skills and appreciation for the complexities of our planet.

Adults grow through continuing education classes, workshops, lectures, symposia, tours and seminars in landscape design, home gardening, botanical art, illustration, floral design, nature photography, birding, and yoga in the garden.

The Community Kitchen Garden has provided the ideal setting for lessons in urban farming, the challenges of food production and community need. It shows the real-time relevance, daily connection and dependence of our lives to nature.

Our education curriculum evolves as interests shift, discoveries are made and opportunities arise. In May 2011, we will host Patrick Dougherty, an internationally distinguished sculptor, for a 3-week residency. Patrick will build a monumental sculpture of woven twigs using materials harvested from local land—a prime opportunity to emphasize the profound beauty of raw, natural elements, and the importance of reuse and recycling in every aspect of our lives.

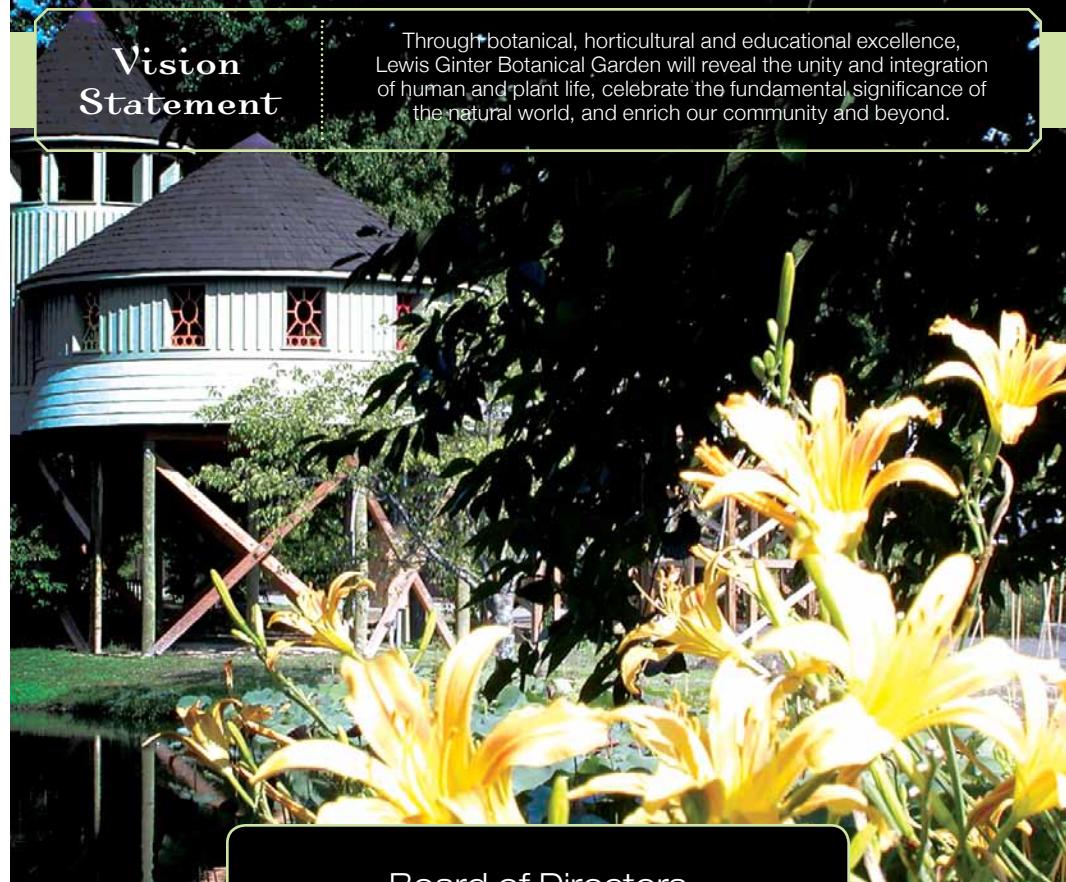

Volunteer Impact Grows

Thanks to our 500+ active volunteers, who contributed over 32,000 hours during the last fiscal year (the equivalent of over 16 full-time staff), the Garden is able to keep pace with increased visitation. Since 2005 visitation has almost doubled, but staffing has only increased by two full-time people. Thankfully, the number of interested community volunteers has grown steadily—and there are even times when applicants are waiting to be processed and assigned.

Students begin volunteering at age 13 in the Children's Garden Service Learning Program. As students mature, their assignment responsibilities increase. They have the opportunity to develop a variety of skills, meet interesting people, and gain insight into potential careers while supporting Garden programs. Some return to help us after graduation, during GardenFest of Lights and at plant sales. Camaraderie develops among all age groups, along with a love of the Garden.

Adult volunteer support comes to the Garden from both working and retired persons, with retired adults dedicating the greatest amount of time. Corporate groups and individuals from HandsOn Greater Richmond help with our Community Kitchen Garden growing vegetables for the Central Virginia Food Bank. Other adult volunteers work daily on horticulture teams planting and maintaining specific areas of the



Garden as well as staffing the Library, Garden Shop, Conservatory, Rose Garden, Education, Children's Garden, Development and Public Relations departments. They also work in the Volunteer Office and can be seen at special events.

Scout groups, fraternities, and high school Key Clubs call to offer their help for special projects during the year like GardenFest display construction and on mulching and weeding days set aside by our Horticulture department. For example, the giant butterflies used at GardenFest of Lights were made by Key Club students and creative retired adults.

Lewis Ginter's volunteers of all ages and talents truly help create a community oasis shared by visitors, members, staff, and fellow volunteers by continually working together for the vision of the Garden. Thank you!

Our Exhibits Flutter, Gleam & Inspire

Our Butterflies LIVE! exhibit was certainly a guest favorite. The 400-500 tropical butterflies and moths in the North Wing of the Conservatory drew excited visitors of all ages—an increase of 3-15% in attendance each month over previous years. On the 4th of July Free Day, guests willingly waited in line for up to 45 minutes to experience our tropical butterfly paradise and see if one might land on them!

2010 brought the mid-Atlantic premiere of 'Glorious Glass in the Garden: The Art of Hans Godo Fräbel,' to LGBG. More than one hundred glass sculptures ranging from realistic—brightly colored frogs and intricate portrayals of orchids, lotuses and waterlilies—to whimsical—"sprite-like" figures, masks and large-scale geometric shapes, graced the garden.

Included in the exhibit are several pieces Mr. Fräbel created exclusively for Lewis Ginter Botanical Garden including the bicycle-riding Longfellows and a breathtaking rendition of the Ghost Orchid. Fräbel's work remains on display indoors and out among the ever-changing garden backdrops through GardenFest this year.

Looking ahead to 2011, the Garden will host world-renowned artist, Patrick Dougherty, in a three-week residency in May. Visitors will be able to witness Dougherty's creation of a site-specific sculpture made entirely of woven young saplings on the hillside in the Anderson Meadow. To date, Dougherty has completed more than 150 works at gardens, universities and museums throughout the United States, Europe and Asia.

Donor support each year enables the Garden to offer free guided programs to one third of all children who visit with their preschool or elementary school class. On July 4, 2009, over 5,000 visitors enjoyed free Garden admission thanks to the 25th Anniversary year support from the Robins Foundation.

By choosing to ‘give back’ some benefits, including guest passes, patrons and corporate sponsors participate in the ‘Share the Garden’ program—allowing us to provide day passes to children and visitors who may not otherwise be able to enjoy the Garden.

The Garden supports programs like Pinwheels for Prevention, an awareness campaign led by Prevent Child Abuse Virginia, by displaying spinning blue pinwheels in the Children’s Garden during the month of April.



Many of our Children’s Garden programs—Green Adventures summer camps, Young Buds, the Discovery programs— are supported by grants from local organizations such as The Community Foundation, Altria, the Lipman Foundation and Henrico County.

By going beyond our garden walls to partner with similar minded organizations we simultaneously strengthen the spaces within our gates—sharing the Garden’s with the wider community.

Community Kitchen Garden

For the second year, Lewis Ginter Botanical Garden is partnering with FeedMore, the umbrella organization for both the Central Virginia Foodbank and Meals on Wheels of Central Virginia, to help provide fresh produce for the 4,000 meals and snacks they make daily.

Tomatoes, summer squash, zucchini and green peppers make up the first garden harvests. Broccoli, cauliflower and cabbage will be planted in the fall. “Our seed choices are based on the needs identified by the Foodbank and what will generate the greatest return,” Tom Brinda, Assistant Executive Director of Horticulture at LGBG.

Our first growing season in 2009 yielded over 9,000 pounds of garden-fresh produce and we hope to surpass 10,000 pounds this year. We are excited and encouraged by the exceptionally positive community response and the addition of many new volunteers specific to this project—often through our partnership with HandsOn Greater Richmond.

Plants are essential to our livelihoods—working with the Foodbank is such a natural partnership and demonstration of the Garden’s mission to integrate plant and human life and fill a pressing community need.

The Central Garden is Getting a Makeover

Our Central Garden Enhancement Project will provide a symmetrical “view shed,” a gardens-within-a-garden experience from the Visitors Center to the Conservatory.

This formal symmetry and balance is similar to the 18th Century Hampton Court Palace Garden in London, grounding us in historic beauty and refinement.

Changes will include:

- Adding and creating walkways on the northeast and northwest sides of the garden
- Installing two triangular display beds—created by new walkways—for planting intense seasonal color, framing the view of the Conservatory
- Adding extra width to the paving on the east side to accommodate more benches

- Creating a cross-axis walkway connecting the Education and Library Complex (ELC) with the Asian Valley garden

This ‘makeover’ will better accentuate the Central Garden spaces and increase functionality and movement, while referencing our historic precedents and providing an opportunity to illustrate the traditions of landscape architecture. Construction begins in January 2011 and hard hats should be a thing of the past when our Orchid Festival begins in mid-March.

Thanks to the challenge grants from the Cabell and Mary Morton Parsons Foundations and those who so generously gave to meet the match!

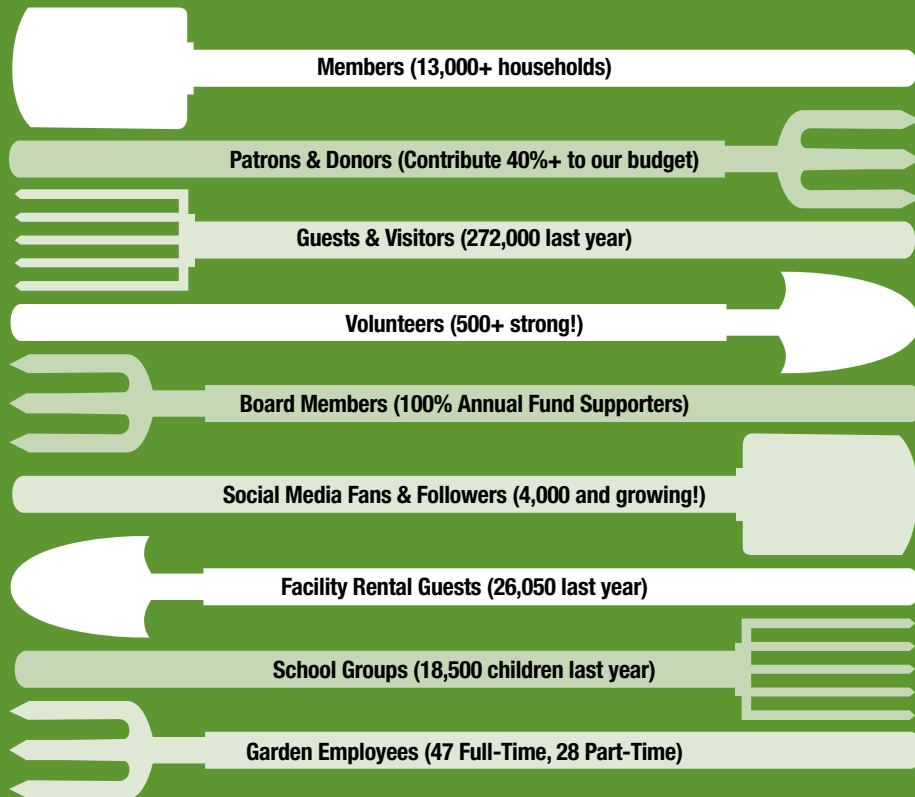

Education: The Heart of the Garden

Whatever your age or stage in life, Garden education programs provide opportunities for active learning. From family adventures like Kid Quest, Garden Art, and Nature Works! activities in the Children's Garden to the bounty of programs for adult learners, the Garden is our region's leading horticultural resource.

Last year over 3,000 adults participated in continuing education classes, workshops, lectures, special symposia, and seminars in landscape design, home gardening, botanical art and illustration, and floral design, as well as related gardening topics like nature photography, birding, and yoga in the Garden. For groups traveling to visit the Garden, topical tours offered by our Garden Guides provided over 2,100 visitors with close-up interpretation of our history, collections, and special seasonal attractions.

The Lora Robins Library collection has surpassed the 9,000 volume mark, with new titles added each month thanks to generous donors. The Library's resources are now searchable from the Garden's website, and the addition of Wi-Fi makes it a perfect research setting. The Botanical Book Club meets regularly to bring together avid readers with a love for gardening.

Educational resources for professional development continue to expand, with annual offerings for teachers, arborists, and green industry colleagues. Many of these programs are made possible through vital collaborations with the University of Richmond, Virginia Commonwealth University's Center for Life Sciences Education, and the Central Virginia Nursery and Landscape Association, among others.

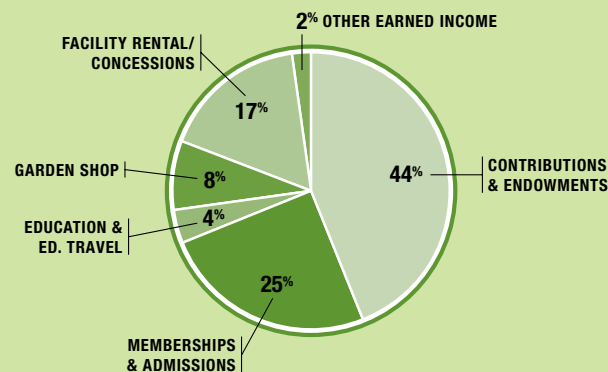
