## What Garden Creature Lives Here?

In autumn, Garden creatures like chipmunks prepare for cooler weather by collecting grasses and pine needles to insulate their homes from winter winds. Squirrels are busy gathering acorns and hickory nuts to store away. We know these critters well, but some say there are other enchanting creatures who live in the Garden that are more difficult to spot. Follow this Quest to learn more about them and try not to blink because you never know who might scurry by.



## AUTUMN QUEST

Pick up a map and a rag at the admissions desk. Then hike over the Lotus Bridge to the Farm Garden. Because these plants have many colors, scents and textures, they are thought to attract elves. Carefully peek under a leaf to see if you can spot one of these enchanting creatures tucking roots into the mulch to prepare plants for winter.

Stroll along Sydnor Lake past the CWD Kids
Tree House. Stop when you come to a very tall
pine tree with large wind chimes hanging from it.
Some say that water nymphs love dancing to the
magical chime music that is created by autumn
winds as they blow over the lake. Do a little dance
and just maybe the nymphs will join you.

Continue to follow the walkway along Sydnor Lake keeping a lookout for the Gnome Depot on your right. Using natural materials, construct and decorate a home that a gnome might like. These creatures prefer woodland habitats. Use plenty of tree debris such as fallen leaves to make them comfortable.
